Congratulations on your child's upcoming preparation and celebration of First Eucharist (Communion). We are excited to continue to walk with your family in this year's journey of knowing, loving, and serving the Lord.

Preparation for First Eucharist will be very similar to your child's preparation for First Reconciliation last fall, with workbooks and gatherings to support your family in this preparation time. As a parent, you can be a witness to your child by discussing your feelings concerning receiving Jesus in the Eucharist. You – with your experience, your faith and your commitment – are the best gift you bring to sacramental preparation. *No program or book can take the place of a parent's personal witness.* 

In addition to attending our foundational faith formation programs or Catholic school, this period includes:

- The expectation that families **attend Sunday Mass** together regularly
- Child workbooks and parent guides that families work through and discuss at home
- **Parent/Child First Eucharist Retreat #1,** the beginning of the preparation time and when your family receives their workbooks
- A **Parent Workshop** to help you by exploring the sacraments at a personal and adult level. With a better understanding of your faith, you will be better equipped to help your child
- **Parent/Child First Eucharist Retreat #2**, a prayerful time to gather together for activities and final preparation for First Eucharist
