Corpus Christi's Pond Project Update

The observation dock was just the beginning. There has been great forward momentum over the last year with our school's focus on outdoor exploration and education.

Over the summer, Justin Reamer installed benches near the pond for his Eagle Scout project. A path was installed behind the pond to make travel behind the pond easier and also to highlight the stepping stones made by Girl Scout Troop #2793, Corpus Christi students, and our guests from St Mary's-Spring Lake for Science Day 2010. We were also blessed with a generous donation of new trees around the pond to provide shade near the new benches.

Currently, middle school stu-

dents and teachers are working on updating and installing additional information markers around the pond. Efforts are also underway to use a grant from JCI to purchase a shed for near the pond. Teachers will be able to store pond exploration and maintenance tools in this shed for easy access.

One of our big learning projects connected to the pond for this year involves purple loosestrife, an invasive wetland plant. We have a growing population of purple loosestrife in our pond. If left unchecked, they could

potentially push all the cattails out of the pond. This would deplete our muskrat family's food source and negatively impact the entire whole-food web at our pond. Corpus Christi middle school students are working with Dan Parker from the Muskegon Conservation District to learn more about this problem. We have begun to survey the population of purple loosestrife growing at the pond to get a clearer picture of the number and size of the plants we already have established on our property. Then, with the assistance of Mr. Parker, we will raise Galeracella Beetles, a natural consumer of the purple loosestrife plant, and release them into the pond next spring before school gets out for





the summer. Come next fall, students will be able to resurvey the pond and should hopefully see a decline in the size



and maybe number of purple loosestrife plants.

We will again be inviting the community to the school in the spring to check out our pond projects. To better accommodate working parents, benefactors and community members we are considering an evening open house Monday May 23, so please save the date on your calendar. In the meantime please take some time to explore our pond and check out weekly school

newsletters for pond updates throughout the year.
